
FFY2013 SPP/APR Measurement Table Phase 2 Evaluation Topics

- Short and long-term objectives
- Implementation and impact
- Alignment with Theory of Action & other components
- Stakeholder involvement
- Methods to collect and analyze data
- Uses of evaluation information





Evaluation Is at All Levels







FFY2013 SPP/APR Measurement Table Objectives and Impact

The evaluation must include short-term and long-term objectives to measure implementation of the SSIP and its impact on achieving measurable improvement in the State identified Measurable Result(s) for Children with Disabilities and their Families and long-term objectives as those children exit Part C.





Objectives and Impact

- Short-term objectives
- Long-term objectives
- Measures of implementation of the SSIP
- Measures of impact on achieving measurable improvement in the State identified Measurable Result(s)





FFY2013 SPP/APR Measurement Table Alignment

The evaluation must be aligned to the theory of action and other components of the SSIP, include how stakeholders will be involved, and include the methods that the state will use to collect and analyze data to evaluate implementation and outcomes of the SSIP.





Alignment

- Theory of action and other components of the SSIP
- Stakeholder involvement
- Methods that the state will use to collect and analyze data to evaluate implementation and outcomes of the SSIP





FFY2013 SPP/APR Measurement Table Use of Information

The evaluation must specify how the state will use the information from the evaluation to examine the effectiveness of the implementation of the SSIP and the progress toward achieving intended improvements in the State-identified Measurable Result(s) for Infants and Toddlers with Disabilities and their Families, and to make modifications to the SSIP as necessary, and how the information from the evaluation will be disseminated to stakeholders.





Use of Information

- Examine the effectiveness of the implementation of the SSIP and the progress toward achieving intended improvements in the State-identified Measurable Result(s)
- To make modifications to the SSIP as necessary
- How the information from the evaluation will be disseminated to stakeholders





In Phase III, the state must, consistent with the evaluation described in Phase II,

Assess and report on its progress in implementing the SSIP. This will include data and analysis on the extent to which the state has made progress toward and/or met the state-established short-term and long-term objectives for implementation of the SSIP and its progress in achieving the State-identified Measurable Result(s) for Infants and Toddlers with Disabilities and their Families.





In Phase III, the state must, consistent with the evaluation described in Phase II,

Describe how the data from the evaluation support its decision if the state intends to continue implementing the SSIP without modifications. Also, the state must provide a rationale for any revisions.





Considerations for Evaluation

- Built into the plan from the beginning
- Based on your theory of action
- Based on data that informed the plan
- Formative data and summative data
- Evidence to show progress
