What are the 618 Data?

All states are eligible *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* (IDEA) grantees. Each grantee must submit annual data to show that states and local districts and service providers are implementing IDEA in the state. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) approved file specifications and forms identify required 618 data elements.





Federal Data Systems and Centers

 EDFacts is the system used to submit data required under Section 618.

- receive and send information to OSEP Data Team;
- receive Data Quality Reports from OSEP on 618 data submissions; and
- submit data notes in response to OSEP feedback.

April Data Submission is due 1st Wednesday in April



November Data Submission is due 1st Wednesday in November







Child Count and Settings

Count of children ages birth through 2 on the Child Count data (date between Oct. 1 and Dec. 1).

The number of infants and toddlers receiving early intervention services

The program setting of children who have an active individual family service plan (IFSP) on the child count date





Child Count and Settings (Continued)

Children with disabilities are counted by

- Child Count and Settings by Age
- Child Count and Settings by Race/Ethnicity
- Child Count by Gender
- At-Risk Child Count (if served by Part C)
- Count of Children Ages 3 and Older (if served by Part C)
- Cumulative Child Count

Year 2016-17

A zero count should be used when there were no children to report in the specific category for the given reporting period. The report of infants and toddlers with disabilities who stopped receiving Part C services during the reporting period






Exiting (Continued)

Report the number and percent of infants and toddlers with disabilities who, during the 12-month reporting period, either no longer received services under Part C prior to age 3 or reached age 3 by

- race/ethnicity and exit reason; and
- gender and exit reason













Dispute Resolution

Dispute Resolution reports all actions related to Dispute Resolution initiated during the reporting year





Dispute Resolution (Continued)

- States are required to submit only aggregate counts in the following categories:
 - written, signed complaints;
 - mediation requests
 - due process complaints.
- The reporting period is July 1 to June 30.

- Data Quality Reports
- State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report (SPP/APR)
- Public Access
- Annual Report to Congress





OSEP Data Quality Reports

- OSEP releases the reports a few months post submission into MAX.gov.
- The reports provide feedback on data states submitted.
- The reports identify whether data are accurate, timely, and complete.
- States may need to leave a data note or resubmit data.

- IDEA Static Tables
 - OSEP provides as Excel files
 - Selected tables from each 618 data collection
 - OSEP will add years over time





How You Can Use the Data Files

- State Level Data Files
 - Comparison between states and national level
 - Discussion with stakeholders and legislators

- Static Tables
 - Display data to stakeholders and legislators
 - Help local programs understand the state data compared to national data

How You Can Use the Annual Report

To answer specific data questions, such as, "Are there any interesting trends in the data about infants and toddlers served under IDEA, Part C?"

- Numbers and Percentages Served
- Primary Service Settings
- Exiting Status



How You Can Use the Annual Report (Continued)



State staff can

- compare data between states and the national level;
- display the data to stakeholders and legislators;
- help local programs understand the state data compared to national data;
- help set priorities for data quality improvement efforts; and
- locate studies or evaluations underway that address a specific question of interest in the state.
