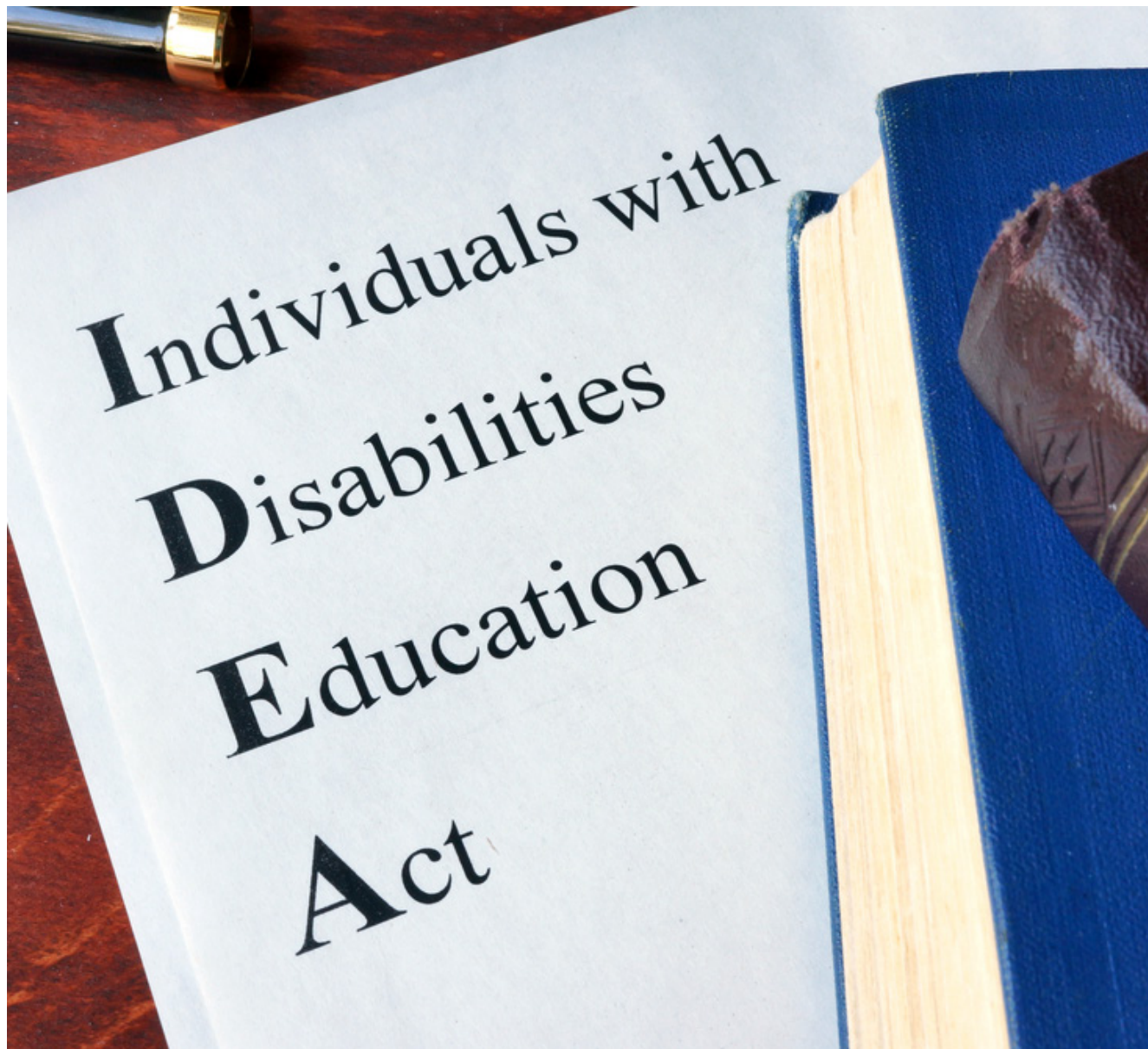

About IDEA Performance Reporting and Determinations

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires each state to develop a state performance plan/annual performance report (SPP/APR) that evaluates the state's efforts to implement the requirements and purposes of the IDEA and describes how the state will improve its implementation.

The SPP/APRs include indicators that measure child and family outcomes and other indicators that measure compliance with the requirements of the IDEA.

A state is required to submit a state performance plan (SPP) at least every six years. Each year, states must

IDEA Section 618 Data Products

Section 618 of the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)* requires that each state submit data about the infants and toddlers, birth through age 2, who receive early intervention services under Part C of *IDEA* and children with disabilities, ages 3 through 21, who receive special education and related services under Part B of *IDEA*.

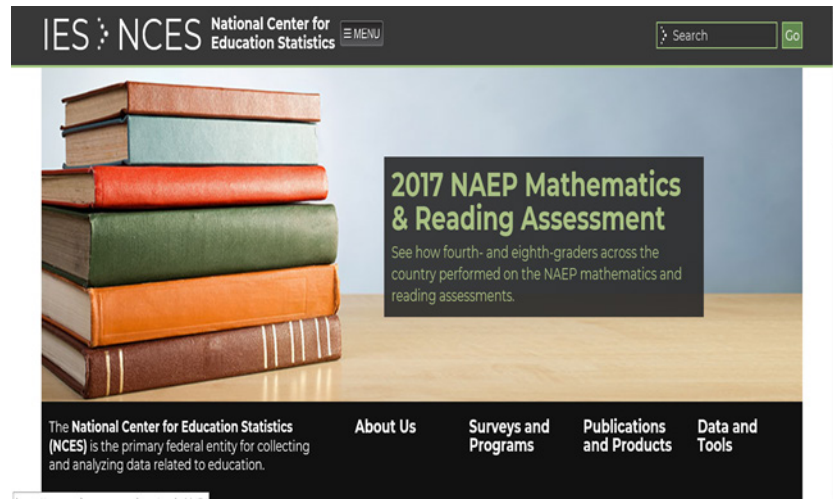

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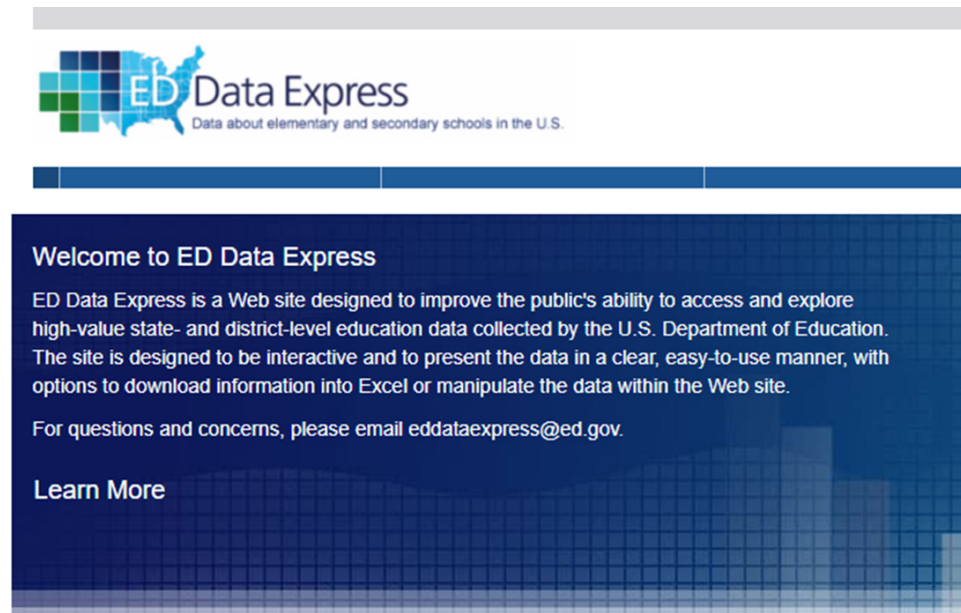

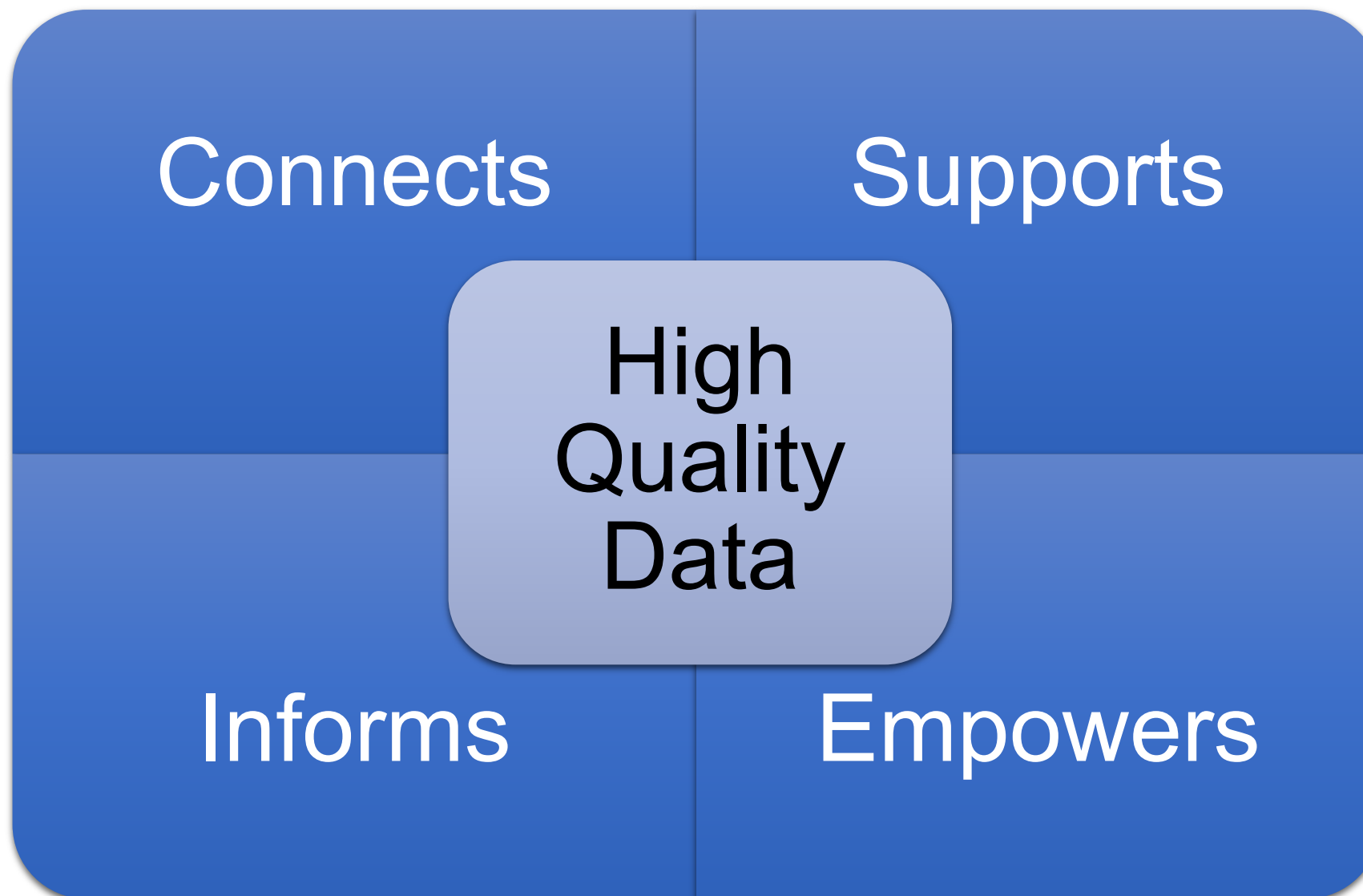
