

Table 3 provides information about the data year that populates each indicator of the SPP/APR. Some indicators require states to populate them with the most recent data available, while some indicators require states to populate them with lag data. When reading this table, it is important to remember

- School Year (SY) dates are generally recognized as July 1 to June 30 in the years specified. States report data as of the dates noted in the data timeline details column in table 1 of this document.
- Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) is from October 1 of the year prior to the year listed to September 30 of the listed year. For example, FFY 2021 is from October 1, 2020, to September 30, 2021. In this example, data for FFY 2021 is expected to reflect SY 2020–21, as they are the most closely aligned.
- Lag data indicates data reported in the SPP/APR the year after the U.S. Department of Education collects it.

Keep in mind

Data are reported by both fiscal year and school year as defined by the SPP/APR measurement table. For any indicators that have data prepopulated from an ED^{Facts} data submission, the data will be reported for the school year rather than the fiscal year.
